
LA Art Show Opens Strong: Media Coverage, Youth Programs & Exhibitor Highlights

The first day of the LA Art Show welcomed **GoodDay LA Fox News** and **Bob DeCastro**, who highlighted our 30th anniversary edition featuring 90+ galleries, the DIVERSEartLA retrospective, and initiatives benefiting the American Heart Association and wildlife recovery. During the coverage, DeCastro interviewed LA Art Show Producer/Director **Kassandra Voyagis** and artist **Daniel Yocum**, whose works are on display at **Casterline|Goodman Gallery** from Aspen (Booth #600). DeCastro also interviewed artist **Robert Vargas** about his large-scale mural "Heroes," which the artist is painting live during the run of the show.

The **LA Times** also featured our 30th anniversary, highlighting artists affected by recent fires, including acrylic artist **Eric Zammit**, whose studio was destroyed in the Eaton fire. Remnants of tools he used and other material are being showcased at the **Building Bridges Art Exchange** booth (#605). The LA Times also featured a sculpture piece that survived the fires from **Bruce Lurie**, whose gallery was destroyed during the Palisades fires, now on display in his booth at the show (#504). The day was also marked by a special visit from school children sponsored by Athletes for Life, one of our 2025 partners. Athletes for Life is a non-profit foundation dedicated to empowering children through sports. Their booth (#701) features not only paintings by established artists LeRoi Johnson, The Producer BDB and Victoria White, but is also showcasing works by three student competition winners: Chloe Im from La Canada High School, Chloe Nam from Larchmont Charter High School, and Lily Goldenhar from Torrey Pines High School.

Booth 600


Based in Aspen, Colorado, Casterline Goodman specializes in a contemporary and postwar art. We were awed by the gallery's exciting selection of photography!
